1. Phone call (Please leave your number.)
2. TEAMS video call (Please leave your email.)
3. Email (Please leave your email. Note that this option will limit the amount of dialogue that can occur in 10 minutes.)

Please remember that you do not need to pay for any App for the TEAMS video call to work. Your computer/phone browser will support the TEAMS process.

## Course Selection for 2021-2022

As of yesterday, March 2nd, all students should have submitted their parent/guardian signed course selection forms for next year. We now start to load this information into our computer system to generate our school timetable for next year. At this time we are not certain as to whether we will have a Semester system model or a Copernican Quarter system model - so we are building both! This will allow us to respond quickly to directions given to us by the PHO, BCCDC and WSBC and honour the courses selected by our students. Please check with your child(ren) to confirm that they have submitted their form. Thank you.

Thank you to the parents for joining us on the Virtual Course Selection nights on February 17th and 23rd. We hope that you found the evenings informative and helpful as you supported your child(ren) with their course selection.

## Quarter 3 - February 1<sup>st</sup> to April 22<sup>nd</sup>

As we approach the mid-point of Q3 we do not anticipate any changes to our classes. Courses that are operating on a Day1/Day2 schedule (12.5% of Q3 classes) for health and safety reasons will continue to do so. As well, classes that are operating with in-class instruction everyday (87.5% of Q3 classes) in a healthy and safe manner will continue to do so for the remainder of the Quarter. Please remember that for those students that are on a Day1/Day 2 schedule it is critical that when they are on their "at home" day they keep up with their self-directed independent study for assigned work from their teacher.



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## Bussing

There will be no changes to our bussing schedules in Quarter 3 meaning that regular bus pick-ups before and after school will continue, as will the mid-day (Lunchtime) bus pick up at the school for those students that are on a Day1/Day2 schedule. If you are picking up your child on a Day 1/Day 2 schedule, please remember to do so at the beginning of the lunch period.

## Daily Health Check Form

Parents are reminded to reference/use the latest [Daily Health Check Form](#) as posted on the main page of the [Stelly's website](http://stellys.sd63.bc.ca) (stellys.sd63.bc.ca), especially when your child is showcasing symptoms of illness. Please ensure that you communicate with your student's teacher(s) and leave a message on our absence phone line (250) 544-0300 or email [stellys\\_attendance@saanichschools.ca](mailto:stellys_attendance@saanichschools.ca) to let us know if your child has an excused absence and needs to stay home due to illness.

One of the most important factors to keeping schools safe is a daily screening for any COVID-19 symptoms, which is why daily health checks continue to be required. To support daily screening, a new K-12 health-checker app has been developed for students and their families and can be found at: <https://www.k12dailycheck.gov.bc.ca> The app will allow people to answer simple questions every day. It will inform them if they can attend school or if they need to self-isolate and contact 811 to be screened for COVID-19.

The province continues to prioritize health and safety within our schools. Our students and staff have done a great job with the new protocols brought in last month. We continue to make adjustments to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

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## Numeracy and Literacy Provincial Assessments

These assessments were completed during their scheduled session from January 25<sup>th</sup> to January 28<sup>th</sup>. This was the second of 4 opportunities for students to complete these graduation requirement provincial assessments. 99.5% of our grade 12 students have now completed the Numeracy Assessment and the vast majority of our grade 11's are done as well. Also, the majority of our grade 11's and many of our grade 10's have completed the required Literacy Assessment. Well done to all of our students for completing these graduation requirements!

The next Numeracy and Literacy Assessment sessions will be near the end of Quarter 3 running from April 12<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>.
