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## 215 - Our Deepest Sympathy

With the revelation of the tragic circumstances of the discovery of the 215 children found in an unmarked grave site at the former Residential School in Kamloops, our community is grieving. On behalf of the students and staff at Stelly's Secondary School we would like to pass on our deepest respect and sympathy for the families of the First Nations communities that have been so greatly impacted by these events. Our school Critical Incidence Response Team (CIRT) met on Monday, May 31st in the morning and were available to all students and staff that needed support from that morning and throughout the week. Our staff and students, working closely with our Indigenous Education department at Stelly's and in our district, developed a moving tribute honouring the memory of the 215 missing children. ## Access to Super Saturday (June 12th) and June 18th photos

Students will be able to access still photos from June 12th and 18th (Staff/Grad BBQ) towards the end of the month. A release date of the still photos will be advertised on the Grad Google classroom prior to the release of the still photos.

## Graduation Verification

As of June 4th, the vast majority of students that were on the SNAG (Student Not Able to Graduate) list have now been moved to the SAG (Student Able to Graduate) list. However, if grade 12 students do not see their names on this posted SAG list, it means they are not in a position to graduate for one, or a combination, of the following reasons:

1. Textbooks and/or other Library books, missing or overdue
2. School materials like uniforms, graphing calculators, Chromebooks, etc. are not turned in
3. School fees not paid
4. Grad fees not paid
5. Graduation course requirements not met
6. Distance education courses needed for graduation not yet 70% complete

For items 1 - 4 listed above, students should return books, materials and pay fees as soon as possible and then see Ms. Batham at the main office with forms/receipts showing fees are paid and books/materials are returned.

For items 5 and 6 listed above, grade 12 students should be booking an appointment with Mr. Redlin if they haven't already done so, as soon as possible to review their plan to complete all required courses for graduation as soon as possible.



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## Restart Plan - A Message from SD63 Superintendent Dave Eberwein:

The province recently announced a new 4-step BC Restart Plan with implementation dates of May 25, June 15, July 1 and Sept 7. Moving through these 4 steps is dependent on the province continuing along the trajectory of fewer COVID infections and hospitalizations. The Ministry of Education and the Provincial Health Office have also provided school districts with clarity and specific directions for the remainder of this school year. Specifically, schools are to remain in our current Stage 2 configuration for the remainder of this school year and into the summer months. This means that all year-end school activities are expected to follow the current safety guidelines on things such as gatherings and cohort size limits.

As you are likely aware, we are currently planning for a return to Stage 1 in September which means a return to regular classes. We are expecting an announcement from the provincial government in late June with more details on any specifics for school operations in September. We thank you for your ongoing cooperation and understanding as we continue to make our schools safe places for students and staff. If you have any questions please contact your school administration.

## Use of Masks at School

Mask use continues to be expected at all times while indoors for all students, staff, and visitors to the school. As well, we are encouraging students to wear their masks when outdoors in small groups. There are, of course, certain exceptions to this new mandate (ie: when having a drink, eating snacks or lunch at the right time and place, or if needing to remove a mask briefly to identify someone). With this in mind, we are encouraging all students to maintain their social distance and head outside in the nicer, warmer weather to have the opportunity to take their masks off for a short time. Stelly's students and staff continue to do an amazing job at complying with all of the health and safety mandates. Parents are reminded to reference/use the latest [Daily Health Check Form](#) as posted on the main page of the [Stelly's website](http://stellys.sd63.bc.ca) (stellys.sd63.bc.ca), especially when your child is showcasing symptoms of illness. Please ensure that you communicate with your student's teacher(s) and leave a message on our absence phone line (250) 544-0300 or email [stellys\\_attendance@saanichschools.ca](mailto:stellys_attendance@saanichschools.ca) to let us know if your child has an excused absence and needs to stay home due to illness.

One of the most important factors to keeping schools safe is a daily screening for any COVID-19 symptoms, which is why daily health checks continue to be required. To support daily screening, a new K-12 health-checker app has been developed for students and their families and can be found at: <https://www.k12dailycheck.gov.bc.ca>. The app will allow people to answer simple questions every day. It will inform them if they can attend school or if they need to self-isolate and contact 811 to be screened for COVID-19.
