

Impressionism and Cubism

Art 9 Research Project

Overview:

This project will give you the opportunity to research a well known impressionist or cubist artist. The information skills focus is two column digital notes, using a database, and becoming aware about the ethical use of artist's images.

ASSIGNMENT:

1. Select an artist who interests you (see list on back).
2. Create a two column table on a word document.
3. Take notes from at least three online sources: World Book online, Britannica, Biography in Context Database, Wikipedia, evaluated websites. Identify each source under the notes you take.

Topics	Information, details, visuals,
Biography Highlight nationality, time, and a few major events in the person's life	
Style <ul style="list-style-type: none">• describe the style of art the artist is associated with (ie. What does CUBISM look like?)• describe the media that the artist worked in (ie. Oil paint on canvas, or lost-wax casting and bronze etc...) and where their work would be shown (ie. in churches, in salons, in galleries etc...)• describe what common themes appear in this artists work	
Famous Works <ul style="list-style-type: none">• List three famous works (include picture, title and date)• Find an image for each one. Include the source (website address for the picture) and the law about its use (use Wikipedia for this)	
Significance <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Impact, significance or influence the artist had on the world of art or other artists	

4. Put your notetaking chart into your teacher's drop box.
5. Complete a bibliography. The World Book and *Biography in Context* do it for you (scroll to the bottom). Use BibMe for your internet sources (including the images)
