Message from Dave Eberwein, Superintendent of Schools (July 31, 2020)

Dear Parents / Guardians,

As you have probably heard, the provincial government made an announcement on Wednesday about the planned re-start of school in the province.

Dr. Bonnie Henry, our Provincial Health Officer, and the Hon. Rob Fleming, Minister of Education, made the announcement together where they focussed on the importance of health and safety as a primary driver in their plan. As a fundamental goal, we all recognize that students benefit greatly by being back in school. As more data about COVID-19 is gathered provincially, nationally and globally, revised guidelines continue to be developed around how best to move forward. Part of this evolution of protocols is the concept of students being able to work in defined cohorts or learning groups. Dr. Henry has implemented this new idea as one that is both safe and manageable.

In her announcement, Dr. Henry indicated that all students in grades K-12 will be able to come back to school full-time in September in defined cohorts (learning groups) at each school level (i.e. Elem = 60 students; Middle = 60 students; Secondary = 120 students). As per the announcement on Wednesday, we anticipate schools opening in September within a revised Stage 2.

As a school district, we have already begun to have discussions on what this model will mean for our schools. District staff are beginning to explore ideas around how the cohort model may affect things like student scheduling. In addition, we are ensuring that any new requirements within the newly revised BCCDC health and safety guidelines are implemented in a timely fashion.
